Wishing you a happy holiday filled with warmth and cheerful celebration.



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EYFS UPDATES SWIFTS and WOODPECKERS

When we returned after the half term break, we were very excited to share our news, so we recorded them and used our knowledge of sounds to write labels and simple phrases. Then we were introduced to our new book Percy and The Storm; we listened to thunder and lightning sound effects and imagined how the characters were feeling. We began exploring people in the community who help us and discussed what

information we would like to find out about them. It was very exciting to go on a walk to visit the local church and meet Rev Ann, she welcomed us into her church and allowed us to handle some of her special objects. We met Rebecca, a nurse from the community who modelled how she cares for her patients and even let us practise



supplies. Finally we met Sergeant Bargus - we asked him lots of questions about his role in the community, including the vehicles he drives, the criminals he meets and the equipment he uses daily. We were very excited to handle his handcuffs, try on his hat and step onto his police transporter.

It was lovely to welcome our parents into our classrooms and demonstrate all the maths we have been learning and we want to thank them for taking the time to learn with us.

During Anti-Bullying Week we discussed how we are all different and that different is good. We explored the theme of friendship through the book, Hello Friend! In Computing we used our fine motor skills, to control the mouse and created a picture of a poppy. Our poppies were added to a whole school display for Remembrance Sunday. We focussed on the book Little Glow and looked at different festivals and celebrations that are celebrated by families from a wide range of cultures and religions. The highlight of our week was working with Leslie Williams and exploring diversity through music and dance. At the end of the week we participated in a workshop linked to Little Glow with Natasha from Chicken & Frog Bookshop.



As we got closer to the end of term the weather got colder, we went outside for a frosty walk and observed how our environment changed. We carried out an experiment with water and made predictions about whether it would turn into ice. The following day we discussed if ice could turn back into water and the experiment could be reversed.

During the last couple of weeks we were busy preparing for our first school nativity and enjoyed all the singing and dancing. There was lots of excitement on the last week as we had a huge snowfall, but despite missing our dress rehearsal we put on a fabulous show and our teachers were very proud of us. We had lots of fun over the last few days performing our nativity, watching the Panto, and celebrating our class parties. Everyone is ready for a rest now!



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YEAR ONE UPDATES CHAFFINCHES and ROBINS

We have finally reached the end of a very busy but fun term. We are proud of how hard the children have worked on such a variety of activities.



We returned after half-term to a new maths topic—subtraction. The children spent time rehearsing the vocabulary and practising their skills, using a variety of resources, including Numicon, cubes and number lines. We finished with solving word problems by looking for the important information, like the numbers we were using. The children have worked very hard - maybe they could even do some practise during the holidays!

We have continued our 'Into the Woods' theme in our Forest School sessions. It started with using tarps for

parachute games and continued with learning to tie knots and building dens. We have also learnt to use tools safely for cutting and whittling. The children have enjoyed free-play too, with rope swings, independent den building, building nests and a range of imaginary play. Our last session was linked to measuring, we gathered sticks and ordered them by size on the floor to create a beautiful Christmas tree that we decorated with natural objects like leaves an cones.





We have made links between our English, History and RE learning this half term, when working hard to learn, remember and write facts about Guy Fawkes and Remembrance Day. We worked on our sentence writing too, trying to remember capital letters at the beginning, finger spaces between words, a full-stop at the end and checking to make sure it makes sense. We also enjoyed joining with the whole school to hold our remembrance service and our visit to the village war memorial.

Our non-fiction work continued with the book 'Little Glow', which gave us the opportunities to learn about other faiths and the way they celebrate. We were especially grateful in Chaffinch class for Nayel's mum, who came to share photos and to tell us about how Ramadan and Eid are celebrated in their family. We also enjoyed our visit from Natasha from 'Chicken and Frog' who talked to us about Hannukah, a Jewish celebration and shared 'Little Glow' with us.



The highlight of this half term was of course the end of term Christmas production 'A Magical Christmas Journey' with the whole school. The children truly wowed us, and Mrs Nicholson, with their ability to learn dances and perform songs. We were so pleased for all the children, that they got the chance to perform together—even without a dress-rehearsal we think they did an amazing job! We hope that you were able to enjoy it too!

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YEAR TWO UPDATES SWANS and KINGFISHERS

Wow, what a busy (and cold) half term we have had!

When we came back to school after our half term break, we continued reading the book <u>The Star in the Forest</u> and we read about the adventures of sisters Pip and Maisie as they followed a bright light that had suddenly fallen from the sky into the forest next door to their Grandparents house. We had the chance to write creatively, exploring the use of adjectives in our writing.

Back in November we began learning about the life and times of <u>Guy Fawkes</u>. We travelled back in time and discovered lots of new facts about the Gunpowder Plot. We also looked closely at World War Two and on <u>Remembrance Day</u> we talked about the importance of the 11th hour on the 11th day of the 11th month. We found out that we wear poppies to remember those that gave their lives to make the world a better place for us. We made our own poppies and wore them for the whole day; Mrs Nicholson lead an assembly where we held a two minutes silence.

Our Year Two <u>Choir</u> visited All Saints Church on <u>Remembrance Sunday</u> and performed 'You gave us our Freedom' to the congregation.

We can't talk about this half term without mentioning our adventures in <u>Forest School</u>. We explored the woodland environment and made wooden toys, took part in den building challenges, made a fire and toasted marshmallows, we also enjoyed drinking delicious hot chocolates to keep us warm and cosy.

At the end of November both classes enjoyed a visit from <u>Lesley Williams</u>. She taught us about the importance of showing respect and understanding diversity. We took part in dances and songs that linked to the book we had been sharing in class; 'The Little Glow' and a fun day was had by us all.





A visit to All Saints Church to see Reverend Anne to take part in our annual <u>Christingle</u> service kicked off our Christmas celebrations this year. We all made our own Christingles and took them over to the church so that we could light them. We know what each part of the Christingle represents, and that this much loved Christmas tradition began in the UK in 1980.

December has been busy for us all and we all took part in our final <u>Nativity</u> performance. We loved performing to you all and we hope you enjoyed watching us. Our favourite songs included 'Follow the Star' and 'Magical Christmas Journey'. We also had festive class parties, took part in Christmas Crafting challenges

and had a visit from Father Christmas during 'Stay and Play' that was very exciting!

We rounded this term off with a <u>pantomime</u>! On Thursday we enjoyed watching 'Goldilocks'. It was very loud, but we laughed and smiled the whole way through!


